





The challenge in making realistic estimates of a FBD burden in India is the lack of consolidated surveillance data and availability of incidence rates of FBD in the country. The Integrated Disease Surveillance Project (IDSP) set up by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in 2004, collects reported food poisoning outbreak information. However, there remains large gaps in reporting outbreaks and related follow up investigations to address the root cause and prevent future events. The number of sporadic cases attributable to wider variety and distribution of foods, may also be very large.




